Reporting to the Indian Law Program Director, this newly created position will assist the Director with the following: operating the Indian Law Impact Litigation Clinic, which handles federal and state court litigation on behalf of Indian tribes; creating and teaching Advanced Indian Law and Introduction to Tribal Law, both fully on-line courses offered in Mitchell Hamline's Hybrid and Executive JD Programs; recruiting Native American students and students interested in the Mitchell Hamline Indian Law Program; and developing one or more pipeline programs for Native American students to encourage them to consider pursuing careers in the law.

Qualifications: J.D. from an accredited law school; strong academic record; law school coursework and knowledge of federal Indian law, tribal law, and Native communities; minimum of one (1) year of post-graduation legal experience in Indian law and complex litigation; and superior research and writing abilities.
